Our government spends around £850M on our behalf and growing, most of it on health and education. I want to see total government expenditure reduced by careful scrutiny and policy change.

I want to see the private sector involved more in service delivery, I believe in government control and private sector delivery. Our government is involved in too many areas of our lives, the recent report into the shape and scope of government would be my starting point.

I want to see a wholesale review of our finances and spending priorities. I want to see fewer knee jerk reactions with the immediate, unplanned and ill thought through increases in taxation we have seen in recent months. I would advocate a more collective and collaborative approach to budgets.

I would not want to see charges for resident car parking permits in my constituency.

Whilst I would look for efficiencies from both local and central government we need a better working relationship between the two in Douglas. I believe that there is confusion and inefficiency in running Douglas. Douglas Borough Council should be responsible for all Douglas matters and held accountable.

I believe the cost of travel on Public Transport for those over 65, should be free.

I believe TV licences for should be free for those over 75.

I would seek to protect the Pension Supplement.

We need to tax but we need to tax fairly

Policies under the umbrella of austerity generally most affect the vulnerable in our society, I want to ensure that despite our economic difficulties we protect our core values such as those that maintain and develop a caring society.

Nobody should pay income tax until they earn more than the minimum wage, pensioners included. I strongly support the raising of the personal tax allowance to over £14,000 per year.

Whilst I am committed to a competitive tax regime it is impossible to maintain the present position where some companies and people pay little or no income tax, we all need to contribute to our shared services, the better off shouldering their fair share of the burden.

I believe we should leave our zero ten strategy alone as it is the backbone of our economic strategy. We should though consider a new business rating system that is more inclusive and fair.

I would like to see the cost of the health service separated from general taxation, it should be clear what we pay towards our healthcare and what we get in return for our money.

Changes to the child benefit system have just come into force. What people may be unaware of is that the calculations for this year's benefit will be made from your income tax year two years prior. This is no encouragement for one parent to consider bringing the child up at home, as the child benefit is based on two working adults. It appears we are on a tax to the max strategy! I believe this to be unfair and not in the interests of our children. The people of the Isle of Man deserve the respect of an open and honest reflection of our financial situation and the communication of a clear plan for a better future.

For generations Douglas ratepayers have borne the cost of running our island's capital. Many of these services are used by all Island residents. Whether it is the horse trams or car parking in the centre of Douglas, I would like to see a fairer system.

If elected I want to see an all Island rating system that spreads the costs of all Island services.

Who is the Island going to be run for?

There are a number of services which interested groups apply pressure in an attempt to make theirs a greater priority. These are all good and worthwhile causes and as a society which cares for it members, we have to recognise that these services have to be funded by resources, labour and products, i.e. bus drivers and busses, nurses and drugs, workmen and aggregate.

These are the four main areas, which over the years, most people show concern and want MHK's to address and sort out;

- political system
- education
- health care
- transport policy (Sea and Air)

Although most people I have talked with on the doorstep in the run up to this By-Election campaign have two issues they are making loud and clear, they feel they are not being respected or treated fairly. They call for transparency in the workings of Government and communication of the Island's financial position. I believe that respect is deserved.

They also feel the big financial issues are not being discussed, let alone addressed, and that the ordinary working people and pensioners are now paying for it. I can see that also.

I believe we should not be following the UK into debt, our present laws do not permit this but if we continue to consume our reserves at the present rate, figures show we will have exhausted our reserves in two or three years! Then what? Borrow from our National Insurance fund? This has been done in the past by an Act of Tynwald. Alternatively go into debt like the UK Government, or even sell out to the UK Government.

I know this may be unacceptable to many, myself included, but we need to understand the real financial position and respect the public with that transparency. This is the very least they deserve and they will be the ones who will be asked to work our way back into profit. The best way of achieving that is to have a clear goal, lead by example and work hard together, back into profit.

For someone who has run a business for 23 years, it is clear to me that we have to GROW OUR ECONOMY. Many people have asked how this can be done; the answer is to work SMARTER.

Anyone who is self employed, in sales or has run their own business, knows that each month you start with zero sales and the first goal is to meet your overheads and tax before any profit can be invested to bring efficiencies or attracting new customers through marketing.

It is clear that the Isle of Man's urgent priority is to return to profit, by reducing its overheads and growing the economy. We have to commit to the true meaning of Value for Money - Economy, Efficiency and Effectiveness – and be prepared to tackle the issues that will have the most impact, in an open and honest way which is the best for the Island in the short, medium and long term.
