

Attract people to the Island

- Effective marketing of the diverse activities that the Island can offer, including heritage transport to boost tourism;
- Incentives needed to attract our degree graduates back to the Island;
- New business start-up schemes, especially innovative ones
- Points system to replace the current work permit scheme;
- Encourage development of a major entertainment complex.

Retain people on the Island

- Support apprenticeships in all sectors;
- Increased places for more nurse training;
- Ascertain the voids in the job market and increase the opportunities for retraining.

• Shared maternity & paternity leave.

Improved infrastructure

- Rolling road and pavement maintenance scheme;
- Do it right first time every time;
- Ensure the cost of regular maintenance is always built into the cost of capital projects;
- Licence companies to explore for gas in Manx waters.

Housing

- Shared equity schemes to help first-time buyers
- Regular means testing for social housing;
- Both of which should stimulate the construction industry.

Health & Education excellence

- Act on the West Midland's review to improve hospital management;
- We need to restore public confidence and staff morale, handing back some of the decision making to the senior ward sisters/matrons;
- Prepare students with life skills such as financial acumen and debt management;
- Investigate the use of medical cannabis for pain relief.

Environmentally Friendly

- Build more passive housing (a house that wastes less energy);
- Recycling-help local authorities to promote wasting less;
- Teach environmental responsibility at school.
- Grants and loans to improve houses energy efficiency & appearance, access to approved reliable traders.

If elected my priorities are

- Resurface the promenade without all of the grand schemes.
- Local government reform such as reducing the number of local authorities to 5.
- Pensions-moving to defined contribution schemes rather than defined benefit.
- Reinstate the free TV licence for over 75's
- Reduce the size of central government to make it leaner and fit for purpose.
- Push for reform of COMIN, in its current form it can appear to be a dictatorship.

- I will be strong and confident, yet humble;
- I will be intelligent not sly;
- I will encourage diversity and certainly not bigoted discrimination; and
