In the face of the current financial challenges, the next government will have the following priorities:

✓ Reducing cost

- ✓ Increasing revenue
- ✓ Protecting vital services ✓ Maintaining our quality of life.

Please find below my proposals to meet these.

Reducing costs:

Smaller, cheaper, more efficient government. With a drastically reduced budget for the coming years we have to look at slimming down the current "Supersized" Government.

We need to:

Reduce management levels in government departments. Establish and protect what is really frontline staffing.

Review the 2006 "Scope & Structure of Government" report and implement those proposals that are suitable in our current economic and financial situation.

Explore the outsourcing of government tasks and services through Public Private Partnerships

and/or Corporations. Government retains ownership but services are run on a commercial basis.

Delegate certain tasks to local authorities. Too often MHKs deal with issues that should be dealt with on a local level.

Protect vital services like Health and Education from the necessary Government cuts. A Nation's biggest asset is its People, and we should look after them.

Investigate possible savings to our NHS budget if high earners would have to take out Private Insurance. This would free up NHS resources and shorten waiting lists. It is a disgrace that thousands of people are waiting more than 12 months to see a specialist, consultant or can't find a Dentist.

Reducing costs: CONTINUED

Remove the Child Benefit Allowance for high earners. Review Government spending on Capital projects. Proposals should be based on a proper business plan with an acceptable Return on Investment.

Spend monies **on-island** wherever possible.
Government, Private Sector and Individuals alike.
Too many goods and services are bought in the
UK. Any VAT paid off-island means less income
for the Isle of Man out of the joint VAT pot and
threatens Island jobs

Explore the possibility of collecting our own VAT, independent from the UK, in the shape of an Isle of Man Sales Tax. It would mean we could set our own rates.

Increasing revenues:

Improve investment climate for new businesses.

Remove red tape as much as possible, there is still too much of it.

The private sector is generating the money and creates the jobs. Government should work with the Private Sector to look for ways to create and improve a business friendly environment.

We need to survey why companies come here and use that information as our selling points to

actively approach existing off-island businesses and start-ups and encourage them to move or set up business here.

Step up our international marketing through representative offices in international business centres (London, Brussels, Washington, Delhi, Beijing) co-funded/operated by the private sector.

These National Tourist Agencies and Trade Missions would be networking host countries' governments and businesses and sell the Isle of Man as a fantastic short break destination and a great base for business.

Employment:

Protect and increase employment.

Tie-up education with local business needs. Ensure that our educational institutions (College, IBS) are offering courses that local businesses need.

Set up programmes to get NEETs (Young people Not in Employment, Education or Training) in employment or back into education through work placements and apprenticeships.

Re-train people.

It is calculated that each unemployed person costs the tax payer 15k per year; it is therefore worth spending money on re-training people for job positions that at the moment are difficult to fill (gaming, finance sector, hospitality). This will reduce our dependency on migrant workers doing the jobs for which no Isle of Man worker is available.

Set up more apprenticeship programmes and make it easier and cheaper for local tradesmen and companies to take on a (school leaver) trainee.

Reduce the cost of Child Care.

Parents of young children should not be held back from (re-)entering the work place because of unaffordable Nursery costs. We need to look at ways of reducing the fees through sponsoring or subsidising Child Care.

Other national issues:

Government

The Legislative Council should be elected by the People.

Housing shortage:

We need a complete overhaul of our Housing System. Whilst there are hundreds of (young) people desperate for housing, there are hundreds of empty properties on the Island. We need to look at ways to encourage property owners to make their empty properties available on the rental market at affordable rates.



Subsidise property owners for conversion of properties to first time buyers housing or rental flats. Explore rent/buy schemes for first time buyers.

There should be a Department of Housing Development which will design plans for new low cost house builds and put these out to tender.

Energy Costs

We need to reduce our almost 100% dependency on expensive (up almost 25%! in the last year) imported fossil fuels for our energy needs and come up with a greener energy policy.

Travel Cost

The high cost of importing goods in to the Island contributes to our already high inflation (currently at 7%!) and makes our Island less attractive to

visitors as a short break destination. The Isle of Man Government should renegotiate the Steam-Packet User Agreement or look into taking over the Company from the current owner.

Freedom of Information.

The Isle of Man is one of the last western countries without a proper Freedom of Information Act. This is unacceptable in a modern society.

IoM-UK Relationship.

The Isle of Man should be steering a more independent course, we are still clinging too much to the UK. We need to establish and improve our relations/partnerships with other nearby countries (Ireland, Scandinavia) and the EU.

Local issues:

Improve quality of housing where necessary, we all have the right to decent housing.

Housing Shortage. See above under Other National Issues.

Encourage local government to follow the national government in reviewing their efficiency, cost effectiveness and management levels to reduce costs. Councils can work together to reduce costs. Encourage and expand existing and new town improvement schemes. Get local businesses involved, actively or as sponsors.

Improve the Bus Services to those areas of Douglas North that are now not well served.

Increase the police presence in certain areas. Existing Police posts are under threat of closing due to possible cuts in the Police budget. The Police presence in Douglas North should stay at the current level and increased where needed.

If elected I will be working closely with Douglas Borough Council to improve Douglas for both our Residents and our Visitors.
