The government must lead by example, operate in a more efficient productive way and no longer be propped up by the taxpayer.

The answer to this question is that the Isle of Man has been able to diversify and must repeat this process of change.

Dominant sectors are not a constant as global changes have a direct effect on domestic ones.

Whilst the DED are one of the departments in place for this task they need to be challenged and results driven. This is not a one department mission; it is everyone's responsibility to rally together for the future of the Isle of Man.
